Dear NRN colleagues,

In keeping with most other activities organised by the Swedish network support unit (NSU), the 17th NRN meeting in Åre promises to be both interesting and innovative!

A two day meeting (14-15 March) is planned to combine the main business of the NRN meeting with the second 'module' of our pilot NSU Training Programme. As we have already communicated, the ENRD Contact Point is currently organising a pilot training programme for NSUs. The first module takes place in Budapest on 19 - 20 February 2013 (kindly hosted by the Hungary NRN), and the second module will be in Sweden.

The overall objective of these pilot modules is to bring national and regional NSU representatives together to participate in a structured and facilitated process of "peer-to-peer learning and exchange" – in other words, learning from each other. If this process is assessed by you (the participants) to be successful, more peer-to-peer training activities will be organised using a variety of training formats.

A total of 34 people from 17 networks registered for module 1. This is a clear indication of the relevance of our pilot NSU Training Programme and we look forward to further building-up the process of peer-to-peer learning and exchange in Sweden.

We are actually rather excited by module 2 of the training programme since our Swedish colleagues will be introducing us to a new participatory discussion technique called the 'RICA' - Research, Ideas, Concepts and Action – method.

This method has been extensively used by the Swedish NSU to engage a broad range of stakeholders in building creative solutions to various important rural development challenges identified through the Swedish rural network. In order to make optimum use of the time available in Sweden, you will need to prepare some materials in advance of the training day - we will be in touch again soon about this.
