Beneficiaries of RDP measures shall provide key information on the implementation of the programme to carry out its monitoring and evaluation;

CASE 1: PROMIS - What is it?

Project Result Oriented Management Information System

Initiated in June 2014 and launched in August 2015 for 26 LAGs and 10 FLAGs (tot. invest. 425.000,00 €)

Manage the selection process

Carry out the monitoring and evaluation of LEADER at two levels: RDP and LEADER/CLLD strategy

Integrated web-based system between:



CASE 1: PROMIS - How does it work?

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CASE 1: What makes a good LAG operation database?

Based on the PROMIS case-study, a good LAG operation database shall present...

- Balance between standardization and flexibility of the data collection for evaluation
- ✓ Data collection based on clear intervention logic
- Integration of centralized with decentralized data management
- Smart application of the LAG operation database to multiple use and multiple fund



Case 2: Training via NRN - What should be considered to set up a successful training?

In May 2015 (Lisbon), training: "Building capacity for planning the evaluation of Local Development Strategies"

Actors involved: NRN, 3 Portuguese RDPs, Paying Agency, Department of planning, monitoring of DGADR, European Commission – DG AGRI (Unit E.4), and European Evaluation Helpdesk

Targeted to all Portuguese LAGs (around 55 beneficiaries)

Based on the following process: *Phase 1: Setting up the training objectives and curricula Phase 2: matching the appropriate method with its specific objectives Phase 3: Assessing the effects of the training*





Case 2: Training via NRN: How did it work?

Phase 1: Setting up the training objectives and curricula

- Build awareness about evaluation
- Ensure understanding of EU requirements
- Enhance capacities of LAGs
- Build the skills of LAGs to plan the monitoring and evaluation arrangements at LAG level for the period 2014-2020.

Phase 2: matching the appropriate method with its specific objectives


PPT, group work exercise, facilitated interactive sessions (ice-breakers), relevant document and literature,

Phase 3: Assessing the effects of the training

- Participant's satisfaction questionnaire, with closed-ended and open questions
- Reflection rounds

Case 2: Training via NRN: key lessons and recommendations

- Assess accurately existing evaluation capacity and needs in order to identify the specific objectives of the training
- Tailor the training curricula to the specific objectives identified in the need assessment
- Assess the effects of the training by mixing different methods in order to establish a continuous process of learning and capacity building
