R.43 – R.44 Share of Livestock Units

- From cumulative to annual
- Only change = how to account for commitments if low uptake
- Investments remain accounted cumulatively
- Denominator = livestock survey (picture at a point in time)
- The support, including to animal welfare, needs to be designed the same way
 - Support to the livestock present at a point in time (or the number of 'places' in a building)
 - NOT to the number of animals produced

R.6 // R.7

- Target fixed as a % in the CAP Strategic Plan
- Thus the target remains the same over the programming period, while for reporting both the numerator and denominator of R.6 and R.7 change every year.
- R.7: Estimate circulated, based on ANC and Natura 2000 only (as in current programming period, no BPS for areas in needs), feedback welcome
