New idea that proves successful in practice

Why to evaluate innovation?

Show the accountability of rural development interventions

Better target the EAFRD support to innovation

Enhance common learning among stakeholders



Legal requirements related to evaluation of innovation

Managing Authorities...

specify in the Evaluation plan the topics and activities linked to crosscutting issues

ensure the assessment of RDP results and impacts, provide answers to the evaluation questions related to

- Focus area 1A and 1B (AIR of 2017, 2019, ex post)
- Cross-cutting objective on innovation: "To what extent has the RDP contributed to fostering innovation?" (AIR in 2019, ex post)

report on evaluation of innovation in the AIR in 2017, 2019 and in the expost



Requirements for reporting on evaluation of innovation

2017 AIR

Quantification of programme achievements in relation to innovation, in particular through answering CEQ1, CEQ2 and CEQ21 and their respective indicators

2019 AIR



1. Identify the innovation potential (baseline)





2. Complement the CMES

1. Review the existing common evaluation elements:

- CEQ 1, CEQ 2, CEQ 21 existing common output indicators
- CEQ 23 linked to headline target
- CEQ 30 no common indicators
- 2. Develop additional evaluation elements based on the previous step (identification of innovation potential)
 - Additional evaluation questions
 - Additional judgment criteria and indicators
