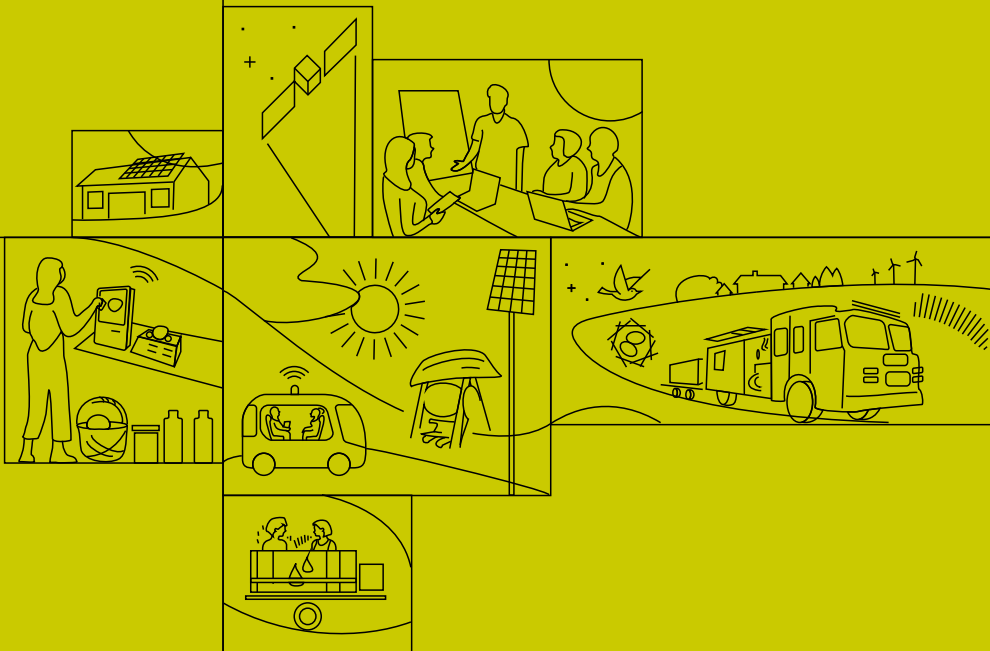

Smart Villages in Estonia and Europe

What is a smart village?

In the rural policies of the European Commission, the approach of a smart village is a relatively new concept, starting from the Cork 2.0 declaration “A Better Life in Rural Areas” proposed in 2016. The Commission highlights the smart village approach as an essential opportunity to help local communities address issues related to providing broadband connection, job opportunities, and services clearly and comprehensively.

The smart village approach is a community-centered operation that considers the region’s needs, specificities, strengths, and opportunities. The keywords are community, cooperation, joint action, modern and digital solutions use, and sustainable use of local resources and opportunities. Each community can be smart in a way that is within their power, focusing on the areas that need the most attention in the joint exchange of ideas among community members.

A separate support program has not been created in the European Union to boost smart villages. Still, it is encouraged to use existing national, local, or private initiative funds and support schemes of the European Union.

To date, the theme of smart villages has developed further both in Europe and Estonia. Several pilot projects that prove that the smart village method can be successfully used to develop rural areas are nearing completion.

LEADER and smart villages

The smart village and LEADER have many features in common. In Estonia, several activities aimed at community involvement, cooperation, and sustainable development have been supported by the LEADER measure. Supporting the strategy process of the smart village, exchanging experiences, and creating networks are the goals of the cooperation projects of several local action groups.

In this publication, you can find 31 initiatives supporting the smart village concept from all over Estonia, which have received support from the LEADER measure of the Estonian Rural Development Plan 2014–2020. All projects are unique and inspiring, focusing on different topics: youth, culture, community development, mobility, local food, environment, development of remote work, crisis management, tourism, connecting generations, etc. These projects are just a small part of the smart activities that contribute to our rural areas, improve the living environment, and increase cooperation between rural communities.

Activities supporting the rural network

The Estonian Rural Network started its activities in 2007. From 2023, the tasks of the rural network unit will be performed by the rural network service of the Center of Estonian Rural Research and Knowledge. The Rural Network has tried to support the smart village approach in Estonia with various activities. Information about the European and Estonian smart village fields is mainly mediated and shared, and good practices and project examples are collected and distributed. Various parties are brought together by organizing seminars, information days, discussion groups and study tours to create fertile ground for cooperation and networking.

Instrumental in the spread of the concept of smart villages in Estonia was the participation of the village of Virtsu as a pilot village in the European Commission project “*Smart Rural 21*”. Several other European initiatives have also had an impact, including the smart villages working group of the European Network for Rural Development (ENRD), the long-term vision of rural areas and the Rural Pact of the EU, the “*Smart Rural 27*” project, *Startup Village*, etc.

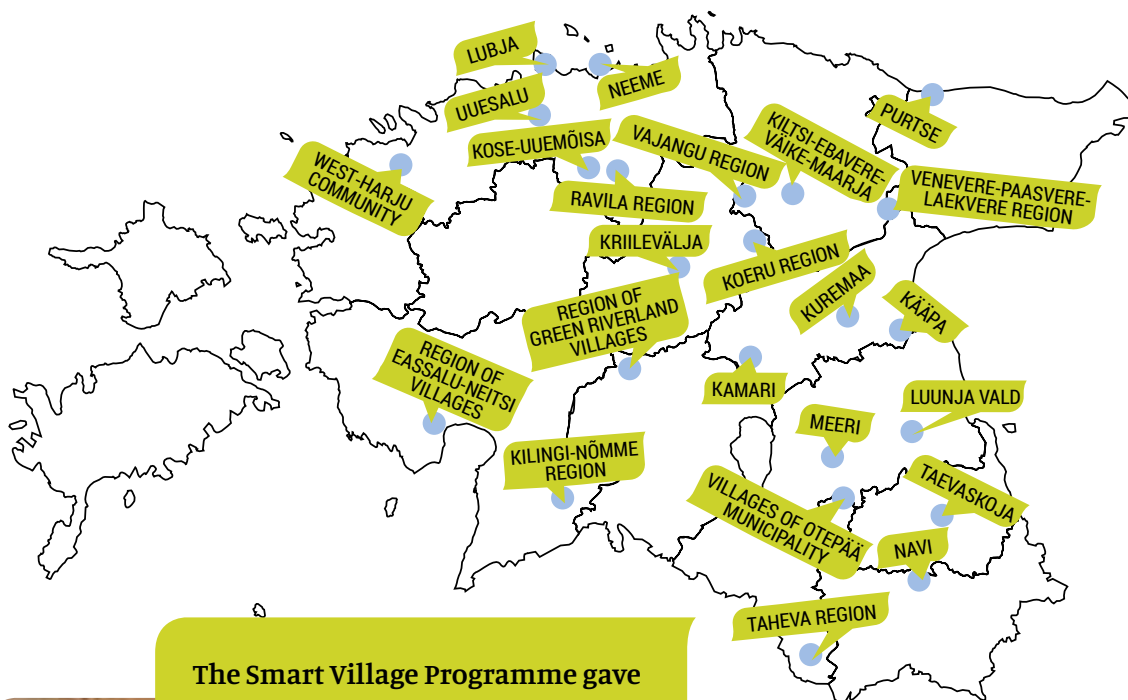
The Smart Village Programme is the largest LEADER cooperation project supporting smart villages in Estonia so far, which offered support and training activities to 24 villages and communities to create a smart village strategy. As an added value, a network of Estonian smart villages was created to increase the capacity of local communities and awareness of rural areas development potential.

The training activities of the programme focused on various topics, such as social innovation, digital solutions, the green transition, the development of cross-border services, smart transport and logistics solutions, self-sufficiency capabilities, and business services. Study trips took place both in Estonia and abroad to gain knowledge and exchange experiences.

In addition, each village was provided with a separate support for the implementation of pilot activities. Thus, the Kääpa community in Jõgeva County, which participated in the program, has launched a series of workshops focusing on recycling. A pop-up childcare center has been set up in the village of Navi in Võrumaa to alleviate the lack of kindergarten places. A village cinema was launched in the village of Neeme in Northern Harju County, and a community kitchen was created in Kamari in Jõgeva County. The Smart Village Programme gave impetus to many great initiatives.

A mobile youth center in a sea container inspires the youth of Toila

The mobile sea container youth center was completed as a result of the crazy determination and courage of the youth of Toila municipality and the cooperation of several good people, companies, and the municipality. A 20-foot sea container has been converted into a mobile youth center, which is located in different areas of Toila municipality during the summer. The youth center offers a service with an innovative and sustainable approach to the youth of Toila municipality between the ages of 7 and 26, which empowers and supports the development of independent, initiative-taking, entrepreneurial young people who contribute to society.

The mobile youth center in a sea container is located in various regions of Toila municipality during the summer periods.



The concept of the youth center was created in cooperation with young people and based on their wishes, needs, and interests. The sea container can be moved to different areas where young people gather, including those who have otherwise no access to the services offered by youth work who have moved away from them. The attractive appearance of the sea container youth center also adds to its appeal.

This is the first time in Estonia the mobility of youth work has been approached in this form. This project is an indicator of how to create innovation in rural areas in cooperation with young people.

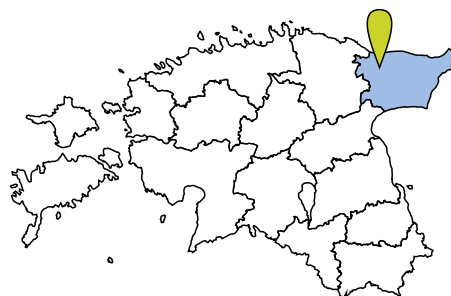

Shared values and endeavors foster a sense of community

In order to unite the community of Kuusalu municipality and increase the activity of the residents of the region, the Non-Profit Organisation (NGO) Kolgaküla Selts initiated a community project. The initiative grew out of Kolgaküla's traditional painting camps and family days.

The project emphasizes intergenerational cooperation. There are events and activities for community members of all ages. While family days and art camps are primarily aimed at children, club evenings and a history conference bring joy mainly to the older residents of the municipality.

Community events bring together residents from nearby villages. Children make new friends, and seniors meet old acquaintances. In addition, the project brings new life and application to Kolgaküla community house, increases cooperation between non-profit organizations of Kuusalu municipality, and stimulates creativity.

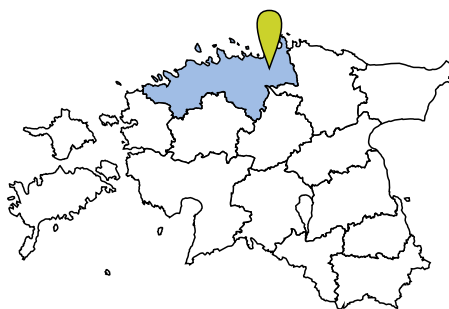

An open kitchen expands community life and food culture

The community kitchen built in the Tuula Community Center has created new opportunities and values for the region. In the community kitchen, local hobby chefs can learn together, provide catering services, and organize food events, trainings, and other events involving the community. Thanks to the community kitchen, Tuula village is also more attractive to guests from outside, creating new opportunities for tourism development.

The community kitchen is built following the “open kitchen” principle, which creates an excellent environment for experiential learning and collaboration. The activities of the Tuula Community Center diversify the local food culture and encourage the residents of the region to start businesses in the catering field.

As part of the project, a new service hall was constructed adjacent to the community kitchen. The hall was furnished and outfitted with hanging rails to showcase visual art and photographs. The chairs purchased for the hall enable the organizing of larger events, theater performances, and conferences. All these innovations improve the quality of community services and enrich the living environment.

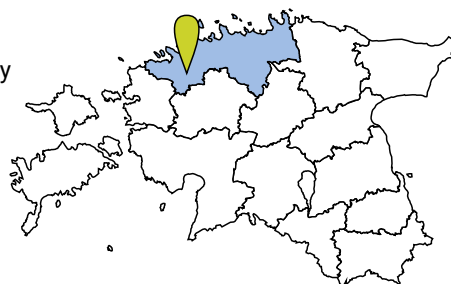

The smart traveling cinema of Hiiumaa brings arthouse films closer to home

Residents of Hiiumaa no longer have to travel to the mainland to see new films because digital cinema technology allows them to enjoy the cinema experience locally. As part of the initiative of NGO Hiiumaa Cinema, digital traveling cinema equipment was acquired in Hiiumaa County, which enables the showing of any film obtained by digital cinema in different places.

Hiiumaa is the municipality with the lowest population density in Estonia, and the insular conditions limit convenient access to large centers. Therefore, smart solutions are important to improve community services. Digital cinema technology allows the cinema to get closer to people and offer them both blockbusters and arthouse films on the spot. Joint visits to the cinema and film festivals increase community cooperation and significantly improve the living environment. Since culture enthusiasts no longer have to go to the mainland to watch movies, it helps them to save time and fuel and contribute to a sustainable lifestyle.



In the implementation of the project, the community and friends of the cinema society offered important support – with their help, the funds for the project's self-financing were collected. Traveling cinema brings Hiiumaa villages together, strengthening the sense of community.

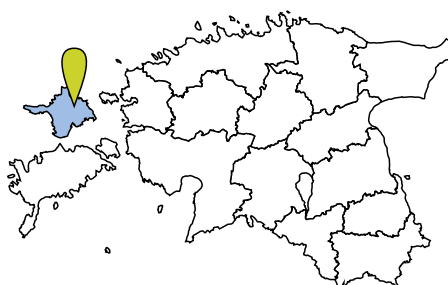

The warm rooms of Paadrema Village Center enliven community life

Paadrema village center in Pärnu County is the only gathering place for the 13 villages of the Paadrema region, where various activities and events take place. Since heating the five ovens and stoves took a lot of time and was quite difficult as voluntary work, it could happen that the house was not warm enough for some activities during the winter period. That is why the village association undertook to update the heating system of the village center - it is more pleasant to operate in a warm room.

Air-water radiator heating was installed in the Paadrema village center building, which helps to maintain a stable temperature in the house, and now it is possible to engage in various hobby activities in a warm room at a time convenient for the participants. In addition, thermostats controlled by

phone via WiFi were installed on the radiators, which helped reduce heating costs.



Thanks to the new heating system, the community is more united. Even in cold weather, the villagers have the opportunity to operate in a warm and cozy village center. The old and reliable stoves are still there in the village center and can always be used in a crisis situation or during exceptional frost.

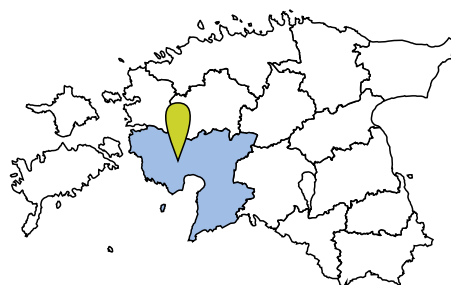

A mobile power generator ensures readiness in a crisis situation

Residents of the Alansi-Harmi-Köue-Habaja region of Kose municipality will now receive help from a mobile power generator in case of power outages. In the absence of electricity, the normal functioning of households suffers: rooms are cold, the water supply is low, and communication services, cooking, and hygiene are disrupted. Coping with a crisis situation requires good preparation and cooperation among community members.

The Alansi Voluntary Rescue Society mapped community centers and possible evacuation points in the area, which can be covered simultaneously thanks to the mobile power generator. With the help of the project, an electric generator that can be moved on a passenger car trailer and a tank for consumption and extinguishing water with the necessary technical equipment were acquired.

Almost 500 people live in the Alansi-Harmi-Köue-Habaja area, to whom the Alansi Voluntary Rescue Society can provide essential help faster thanks to mobile devices. Ensuring autonomous electricity and drinking water allows one to cope in a crisis or dangerous situation!

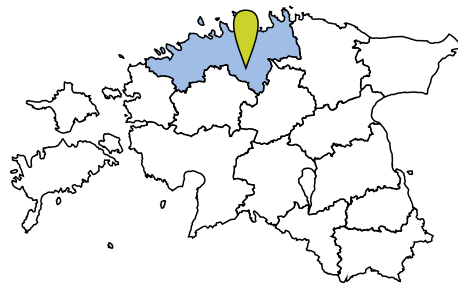

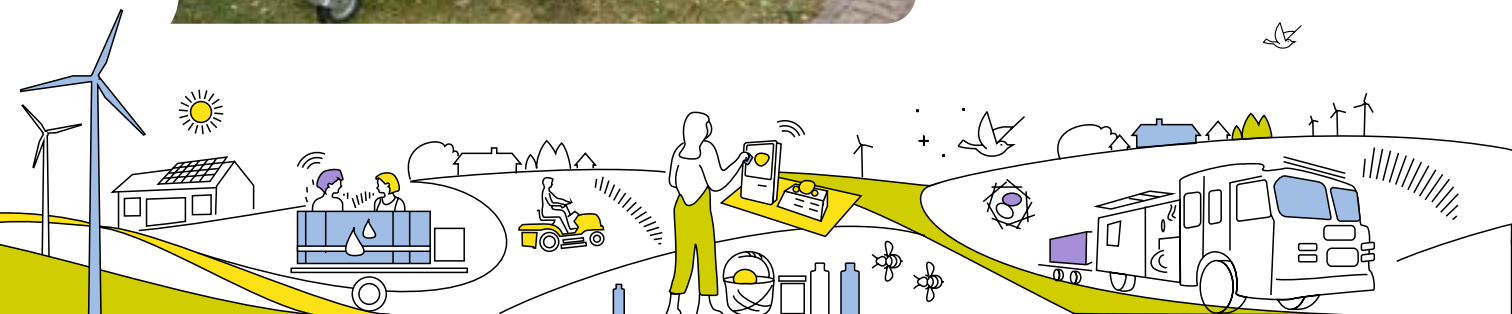
Sauna traditions and culture have had an important place in Estonian everyday life. The sauna plays an important role in rural communities and villages because it brings people together, heals them, and relaxes their senses.

Lohusuu company Lorest OÜ has brought innovation to the sauna landscape of the region. A contact-free mobile hot tub and barrel sauna rental service has been created. During the project, a building was erected in which rental objects (saunas, barrels, grills, party tent) could be stored, maintained, and rented out contact-free. The building can be opened remotely. The customer can rent and return the desired inventory without coming into contact with other people. This makes the service more accessible, and there is no need to hire a separate person to interact with customers on-site.



The project contributes to the sustainability and rapid development of the company and gives the residents of the region the opportunity to use a new and convenient service that diversifies leisure time. Sauna connects communities!

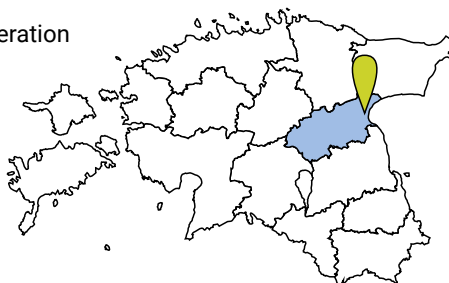

Community-based entrepreneurship is being developed in Umbusit

The Umbus Village Society and the Khordong Association have taken the promotion of Umbus Village life to heart. Various topics of village life are approached in a communal way, be it by organizing barn-raising campaigns, sharing transport, watching the neighborhood, or organizing the annual Umbusi Day.

Many villagers have their own yards and gardens that need to be mowed and cultivated, but it is not wise to buy or rent larger equipment for this alone. Thus, it was found that the village could have its own tractor with the necessary accessories to ensure the mowing of natural grasslands, the management of small agricultural land for the cultivation and production of local food, the management of wasteland in hard-to-reach places, and forest management with the possibility of making firewood.

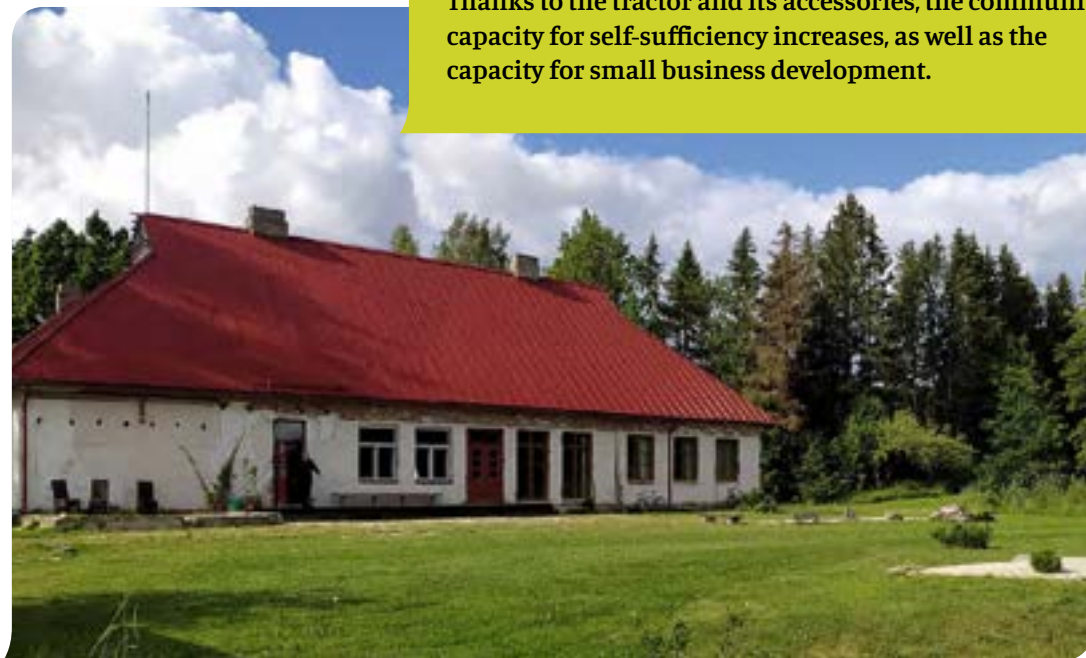


The village will acquire a tractor and, as accessories, a front loader, a bucket, a maintenance mower, and a tiller, with which it will be possible to offer services in the community for cultivating garden land, mowing grasslands, and forest maintenance.

Thanks to the tractor and the accessories, the self-sufficiency of households increases, as well as the ability to develop small businesses.

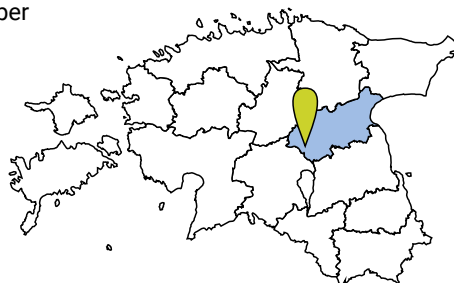

United Oisu community

The village of Oisu in Järva County has been given a new lease of life - joint events are held, cooperation is carried out both within the community and with neighboring villages, and the cultural heritage of the region is proudly highlighted. The Oisu community has achieved a united mind and perception!

The community project of the NGO Oisu Culture and Development Society contributed to the activation of community life in Oisu. The purpose of the initiative was to unite the people of the Oisu area through interesting joint activities and regional events, to expand the activities of the Oisu library as a community gathering place and to increase its importance, to bring the residents closer to their hometown through joint recollection, the development and preservation of traditions, and the storage of history.

A total of over 800 people participated in the project's events, and as a result of joint action, cooperation intensified on several levels - between the members of the non-profit organization, between the villagers and the association, and between local institutions. Local social

life became livelier, and the willingness to work together increased. Several new joint activities and traditional undertakings have been organized.

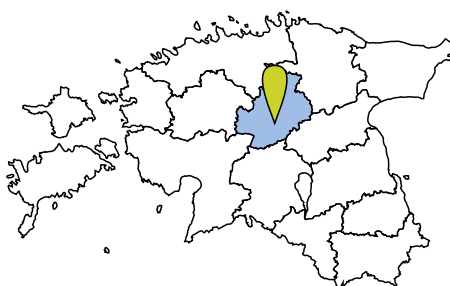

Mobile hot water

Exciting events (handicraft and old goods days, fairs) and children's excursions are organized all year round in the Veski Farm located next to Kolga-Jaani, and the museum is open. During the virus crisis, maintaining hygiene became very important, but there was no opportunity to wash hands with warm water at outdoor events and large gatherings. A mobile hot water washing station was developed to solve the problem.

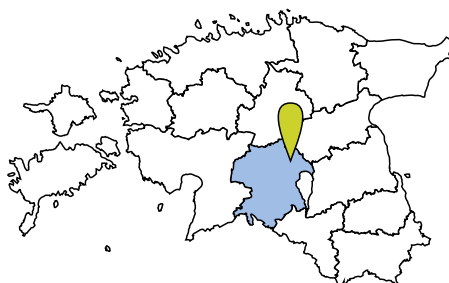
In order to obtain hot water, a factory-made domestic hot water system, "Nutikas", with all safety requirements, was installed on a trailer. The system uses solar energy to heat water, in case of cloudy weather there is a possibility to use electricity. The solution also allows the device to be connected to the building's water systems and used as an outdoor shower. The device can be transported and used at various community events and construction sites, but also in case of power outages near residential buildings. In the future, it is planned to change the system so that it would store energy and add batteries. Hot water anytime!

EstPol — for community sustainability

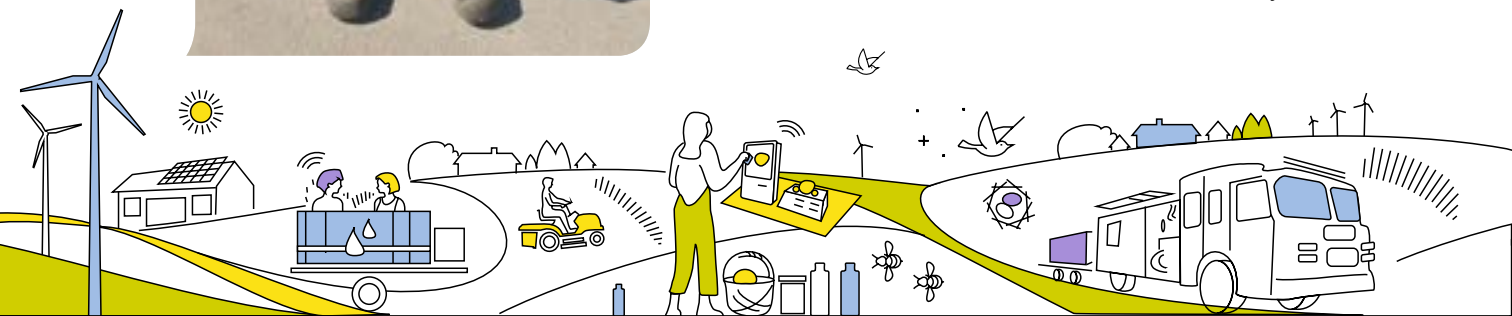
Several communities face leadership burnout and generational issues. By learning from each other's experiences and sharing the bottlenecks associated with different activities, it is possible to find the best solutions. It was for this purpose that Kodukant Läänemaa and Nelja Valla Kogu joined forces and launched a national cooperation project.



The project started with a bottom-up approach. A meeting was organized where residents of the area could share their concerns and ideas and propose new approaches to solving old problems. This gave the participants the opportunity to see their situation through the eyes of an outsider and to get new inspiration for the implementation of further activities.

With the help of the project, a five-module development seminar for community leaders, a conference on the internal security of communities, and a co-operation conference were organized. In addition, a study visit was arranged to acquire skills and knowledge from Maltese volunteers.

The project supported the creation of sustainable communities in rural areas through the use of local resources and exchange of experience, increased the activity of the residents of the area of operation and the number of participants, and improved awareness of activities related to local security.

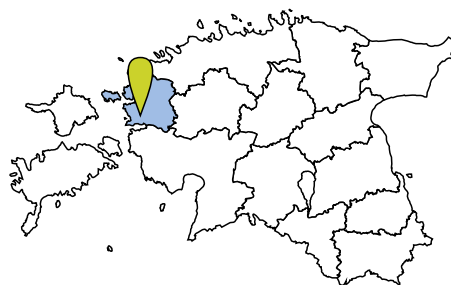

The self-service *pop-up* sales counter had been operating for many years, was successful, and worked well, but the drawback was that goods could only be paid for in cash. In addition, the wish was to sell various farm products and cider in a contact-free manner. However, the sale of alcohol has its own conditions, which could not be met by the roadside.

With the help of the project, a small garden house was acquired, which was furnished with the necessary equipment - shelves, a table, a showcase refrigerator, a self-service cash register with a card payment terminal, and an integrated scale. In addition, there is also a luggage locker for those who pre-order.

The assortment of the tiny shop is extremely wide: cider vinegar, cider jelly, various jams, syrup, vegetables, honey, Camelina oil, beers, cheeses, spicy sauces, eggs, various herbal teas, porridge flakes and flours, raw buckwheat, etc. In the new season, the selection of products will definitely be expanded.

The Kloostrimetsa farm shop is innovative and allows customers to self-service without a salesperson at the smart cash register – cost savings, revenue growth for the salesperson, and greater flexibility and product selection for customers. Everyone is happy and fed!

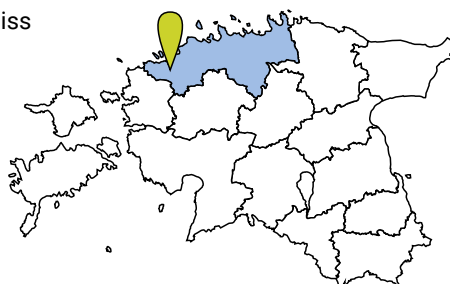

Creation of a multi-purpose community center in Otepää - synergy between community activists, entrepreneurs, and creative people

In Otepää, there was a shortage of rooms where collaborative activities could be organized in such a way as not to cause significant expenses for room rent and catering – it was decided that a new but underutilized market building would be put into use. A brainstorming session was organized for community leaders, small producers, and the local government to find out the services of the new community cooperation center.



Based on the results of brainstorming, the project was used to establish a multifunctional community center that offers four new services:

- community kitchen and cafe for organizing workshops and joint cooking;
- a training and collaboration area suitable for holding various meetings;
- children's playroom for playing and organizing events;
- a quiet room that can be used both for remote work and, for example, for participating in online training.

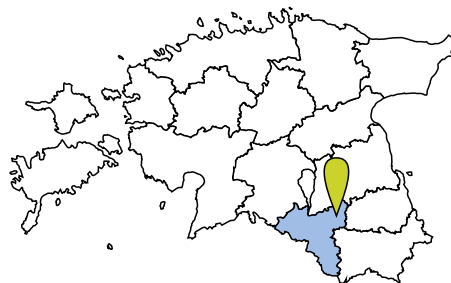
The Otepää community center has proven during its short period of operation that it is on the right track. People have embraced the community center, and a lot of work has been done on a volunteer basis. It is the multitude of possibilities and the availability of services that invite people to organize their meetings or just have a good time here.

Busy, educated, and cooperative Lipa neighborhood

Since educational activities no longer took place in the Lipa school building, the building was underutilized. Only a small kindergarten group and the Raikküla leisure center operated in the building. Lipa's neighboring village, Keo, is small but has contributed quite a lot to the development of the community in a short time.

The joint project with three partners - the NGO Lipa Village, Keo Village Society, and Raikküla Leisure Center – allows expanding the circle of beneficiaries and increasing community activity, offering new solutions for increasing the identity of the locality valuing culture and history.

With the help of the project, a total of 17 different activities were organized for community members of all ages: training, adventure days for children, and sports and cultural events. The largest activities were the organization of events for the 170th anniversary of Raikküla's educational life, the 110th anniversary of the building of the Raikküla Ministry School, and the 110th anniversary of Uku Masing's birth.

Organized events have united and expanded the active community and offered various experiences to the residents of the area.

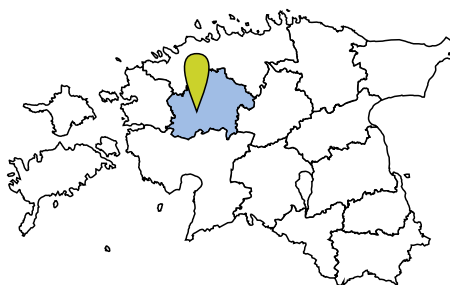

Special opportunities to work indoors and outdoors in Loovusait

The main goal of Loovusait was to create an innovative brainstorming and collaboration environment.

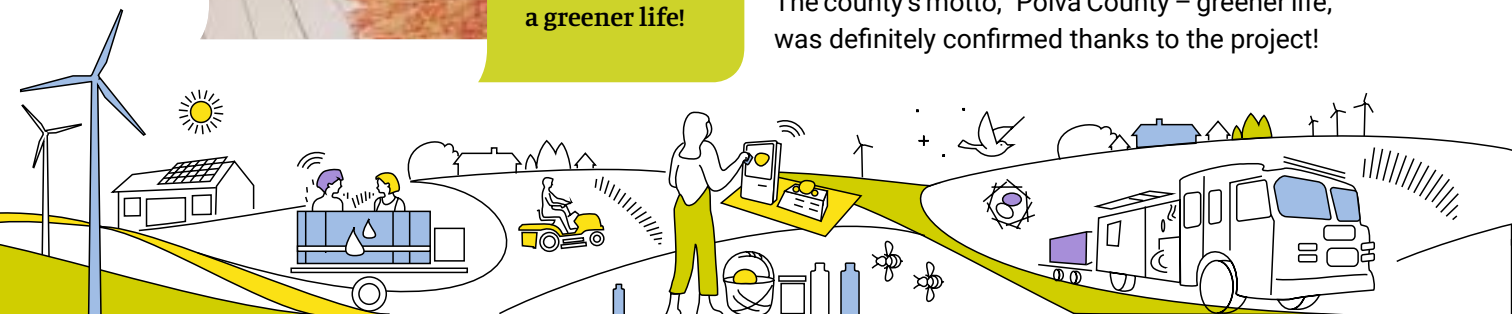
With the help of the project, a remote work office with amenities was built for year-round use, which can also be used for organizing various gatherings. Since it is a place of natural beauty and it has been scientifically proven that being in nature makes people more creative and movement (in nature) makes the brain work, the possibilities of working outdoors were also developed – outdoor furniture, a parasol, and gas heaters were purchased.

As a result of the project, Põlva County now has a distinctive and unique remote work and cooperation center and a sauna area for relaxing on the lake shore. This will definitely add value to the area and bring in new business customers who would otherwise be unlikely to come to the area.

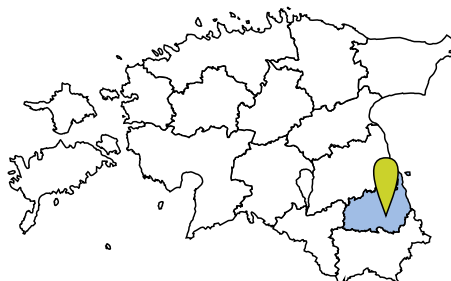

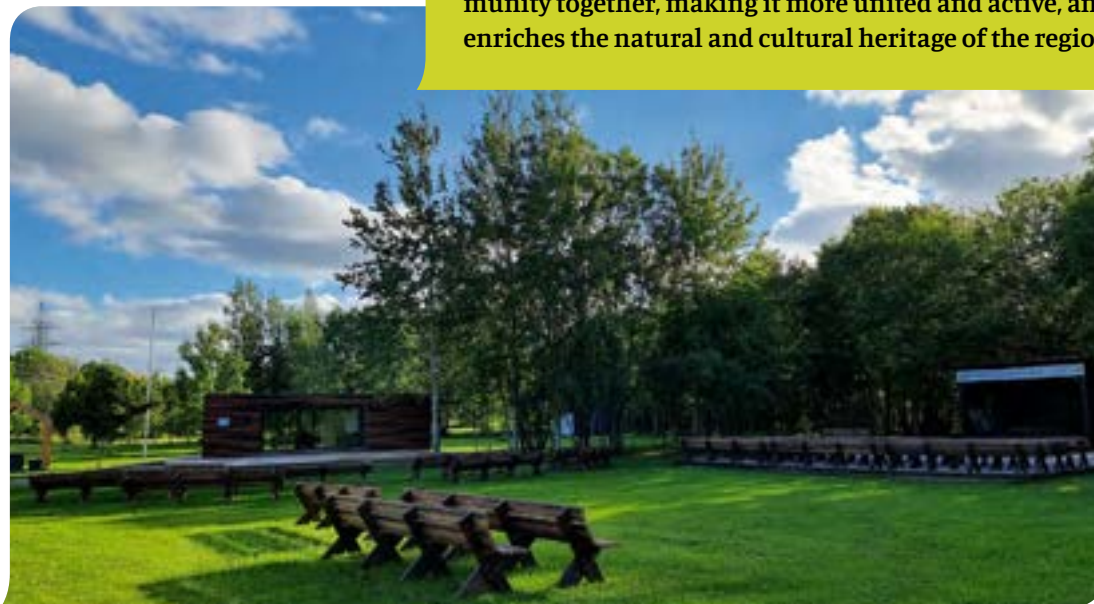

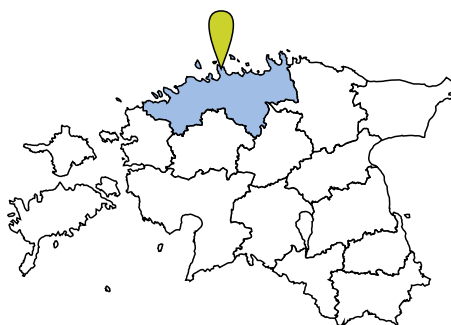

The association had a workshop and a certain amount of equipment before the implementation of the project, but in order to offer higher quality and more versatile service, the conditions of the room were improved, and the equipment fleet was supplemented.

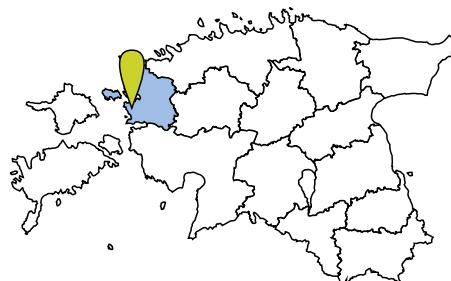

Creation of a remote workplace in Rääpina

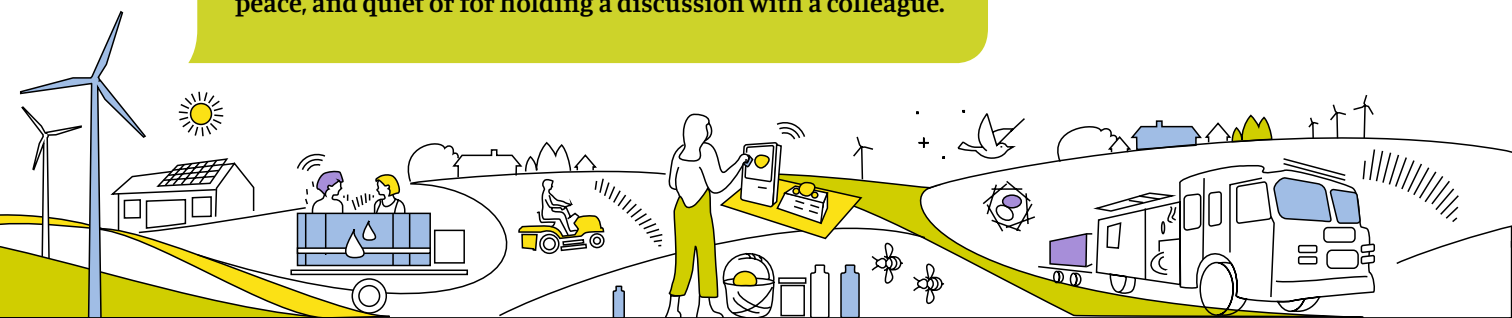

Increasing community resilience and effective functioning in crises

Volunteer rescuers and the local community must be well prepared for crises and accidents. The purpose of community resilience is to maintain efficient functioning, safety, and continuity of essential services regardless of whether the situation is a crisis or not. The Pärnu-Jaagupi Firefighting Society has made it a priority to prepare the community for crises.

In the course of the project, the necessary equipment for the organization of training, a mobile electricity generator, and a crisis room were furnished for crisis accommodation. The trainings take place continuously because, in addition to general knowledge, volunteer rescuers, municipal employees, and other community members have to consider different roles in dealing with a crisis situation.

The electric generator can be transported to a place where there is a critical need for objects important to the community: school buildings, kindergartens, nursing homes, family medical centers, water and sewage pumping stations. The crisis room must give people the opportunity to be warm and quickly recover from situations caused by nature or people. The room will be furnished with field beds, mats, sleeping bags, and bed linen. Volunteer rescuers have not had the means and opportunities requested in the project before.

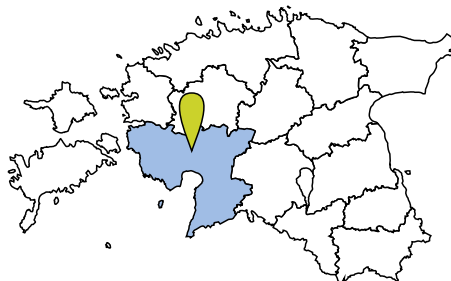

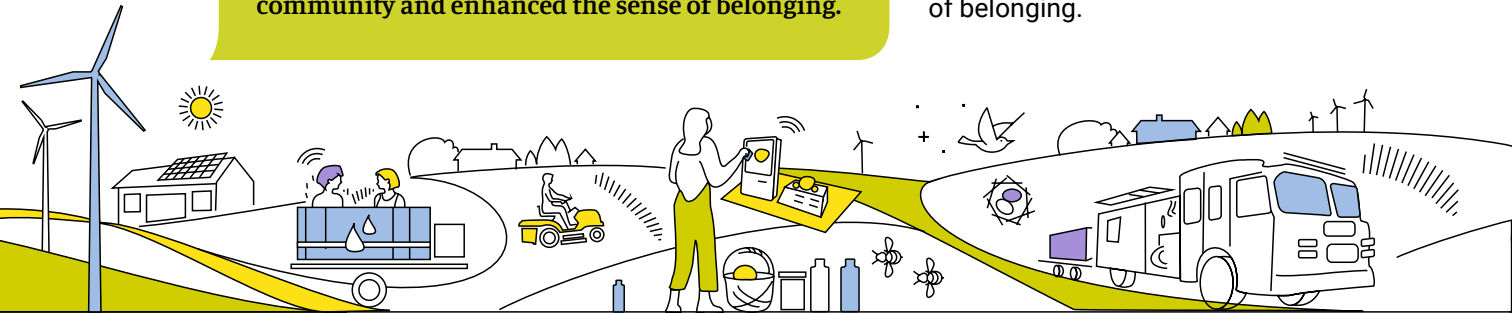
The visual appearance of the region's signs and website was organized under the leadership of the Green Riverland Partnership. The Soomaa region received specially designed gates to Suure-Jaani and Tori, O-shaped information cards, border markers, and signs marking the Soomaa flood record.

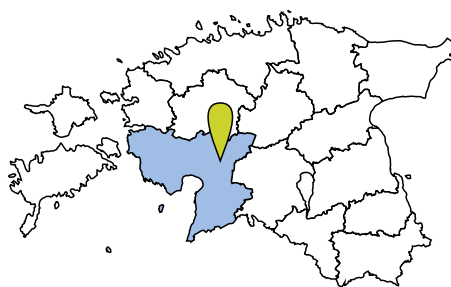

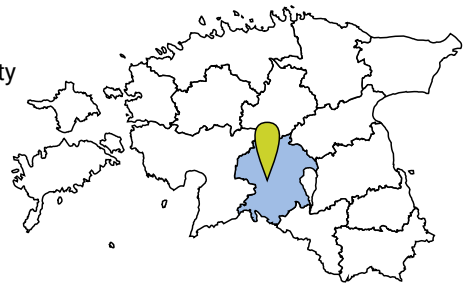

Smart solutions in public spaces help reduce the carbon footprint

The adoption of energy and environmentally sustainable solutions is a growing trend in a world facing climate change. Public space is a guide. There are solar-powered garbage cans in Ulvi village in Vinni municipality, as well as composting devices that use renewable energy in Ulvi Kodu nursing home and kindergarten.

The garbage can is made of 100% recyclable materials and is vandal-proof thanks to the 3 mm steel material, and the lid is opened with a foot-operated pedal. A smart garbage can with a built-in press compresses waste 5 - 8 times, being connected to a remote control platform through sensors and a GPS system, through which the need to empty is signaled.

The composting device helps to reduce the amount of bio-waste sent to the landfill, thereby reducing the amount of methane gas generated from organic waste and the emission of carbon dioxide, i.e., the carbon footprint. The waste input capacity is 4-5 kg per day, with a waste reduction of 80-90%, requiring compost removal only once a week.

We are happy to note that smart garbage cans and composters have also received positive attention from the media and residents.

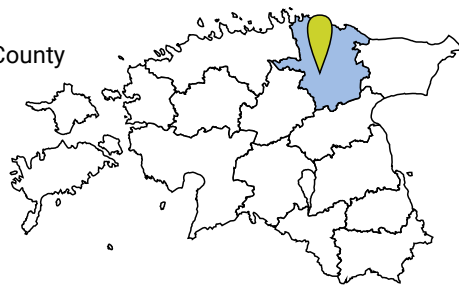

The town of Laekvere now has a modern skateboard park, which provides activities and delights the local youth. The idea of building a skate park started during the regional strategy discussions.



During the joint discussions of the residents of the region and the employees of the municipality, two topics came up: to demolish the building, which has been empty for years and has become dangerous, and to create more outdoor leisure opportunities for the whole community. The demolition freed up 600 square meters of free space, where the sports facility was well suited. Elements of a skate park, two posts with LED lights, a security camera, and wooden borders were installed there. The complex also includes a wooden shelter and a bicycle rack. Those who are not attracted by the activities of the skate park can do activities in the fresh air: use the outdoor table tennis set, play chess, or have a picnic on a table with chess squares.



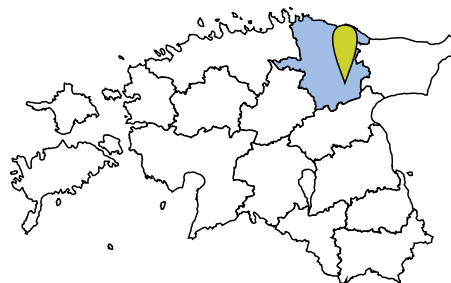

When the playground becomes a community meeting place

Haljala's family playground offers fun for all ages, with plenty of space for sports, games, and relaxation. The ice rink, open in winter, attracts hockey fans, and one can go sledding on the slopes.

In Haljala, a small town, there was a lack of children's playground attractions for different age groups, where there would be activities for both children and parents at the same time. According to the previous detailed planning, the property was already the land under the recreation facility. Since the land was underutilized and spoiled the visual of the living environment, the goal of building the new square was to create a whole in the public space in order to diversify the movement habits of the residents and increase the attractiveness of the living environment.

The busy Tahmaküla community, which has been organizing the Tahmaküla street festival for several years, was now at the forefront of the initiative. The project started with soil planning and

relief design. Swings for children of different ages, a drawing board, a carousel, balance, and climbing areas for different age levels, a hammock, an exercise ground, various activity walls, a tunnel and a playhouse for small children, a table tennis and chess table, a fussball, a toy ship representing an old fishing boat, a bicycle rack, benches, etc. were installed on the family playground.

We are happy to say that during the work that took place in May 2023, community members planted a spruce hedge on the square.

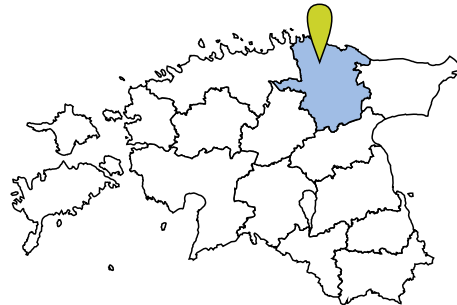

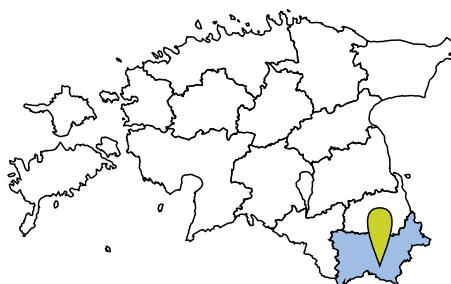

Even the bus stop information board has a look typical of a fishing village: the roof is shaped like a boat, and the sides of the board are shaped like a fish, which provides good protection from the wind.

The need for a lighted and sheltered bus stop came to the fore when the number of families in the village of Atla increased and the number of school-going children increased. In addition to the passengers, the bus drivers also needed lighting in order to better maneuver the buses on the narrow road with deep ditches.

The active village association found out that there were many needs for better organization of village life. In addition to a bus stop, there was a lack of a village notice board. That's how we came up with the idea that the new information stand could be multifunctional, with mailboxes, a shelter with a bench for waiting for the bus, and, of course, the possibility to hang notices.

Locals are of the opinion that the appearance of the old fishing village has now become more attractive and modern, and the lighted bus stop helps to increase the community's sense of security.

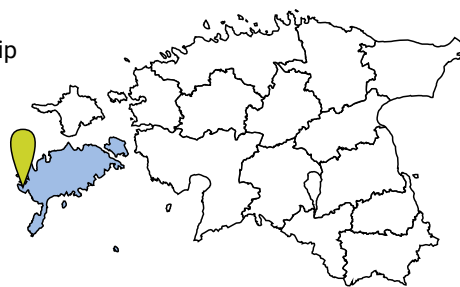

Laimjala Bus Shelter inspires people all over the world

What is the best way to introduce local alluvial plants and butterflies and to teach nature conservation and environmentally conscious behavior? All along with outdoor learning and at the bus stop! No kidding, the islanders have done it well. For this purpose, a dingy bus shelter, almost half a century old, was renovated, the walls of which were painted with beautiful alluvial plants.

The village of Laimjala has developed well in the last decade. Several significant objects, such as the village store, Laimjala community center, outdoor library, etc., have received a new look, but the bus shelter caught the eye with its appearance. Laimjala Nature Friends Society came to the rescue, under the leadership of which the pavilion was renovated into an interactive outdoor learning place for both locals and the guests of the island. In addition to the aesthetic and functional improvement, the bus waiting pavilion now has the option of sorting garbage, a new limestone floor and oak benches, 64 alluvial vascular plants, and 12 butterflies with scientific names in Estonian, English, and Latin were painted on the interior surfaces of the building with exact species characteristics.

The Laimjala village initiative has received a lot of attention in Saaremaa and around the world.

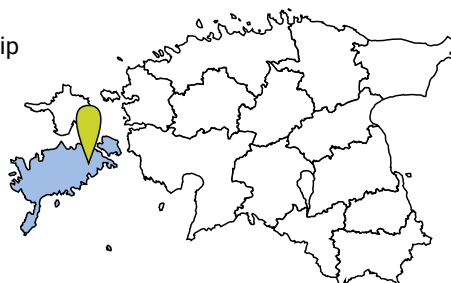

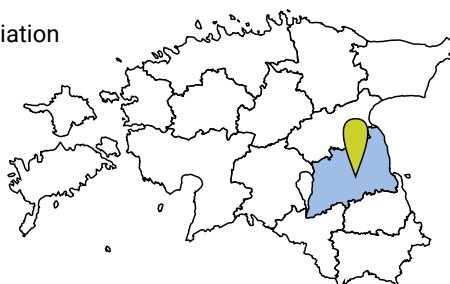
