


Sectoral data for monitoring and evaluation

THE EXPERT GROUP FOR MONITORING AND EVALUATING THE CAP

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Why we need the data

- Need to monitor and evaluate the performance of all support instruments in a wider context of assessment of CAP for:
 - a) justification of the spending of taxpayer's money
 - b) future policymaking
- All sectors, except wine and apiculture are, planned, reported and cleared at the operational programme level, i.e. no detailed data at intervention level. Sectoral data submission requirement is a trade-off for the simplification of the clearance

Which data is to be reported

- Largely equivalent to what is submitted under the current CAP for sectoral programmes
- Data at sectoral level:
 - By sector, covering all sectors. Crop area for crop sectors, number of animals for livestock sectors.
 - Data on fresh/processed products for F&V
- Data on interventions by sector, aggregated (all POs), covering all sectors with operational programmes.
- Data on apiculture (in addition to APR intervention level data)
- Data on wine (in addition to APR intervention level data)

Relevant aspects with regards to the data

- Basis for the data:
 - Existing data submission requirements under the current CAP
 - CMO Regulation 1308/2013 for recognised POs
 - Delegating Regulation (EU) 2017/891 and Implementing Regulation (EU)
 2017/892 for F&V
 - Implementing Regulation (EU) 2016/1150 for wine
 - Implementing Regulation (EU) 1368/2015 for apiculture
 - New date submission requirements
- Period of reporting: financial year

Relevant aspects with regards to the data (cont)

- Aggregation of data
- Timing of data submission (aligned with other types of interventions or derogation for sectoral data)
- Certification (data vs data systems)
- Reporting system (SFC vs ISAMM)
- Correction of data

Conclusions

- Need some details on interventions funded, which is not collected in the APR due to the simplified clearance model
- Large part of the data collection is already existing due to current data submission requirements
- Aggregated, non-certified data per financial year
- Form of the data submission requirement: delegated act(s), based on Art 129 SPR. To be determined if one comprehensive act or per each sector
- MSs welcome to review and advise on data that is superfluous or, indeed, missing from the list
