

ITALIAN RURAL NETWORK: HOW IT WORKS

- Ministry of Agriculture is the Managing Authority
- Two main implementing bodies: CREA (Council for Agricultural Research and Economics) and ISMEA (Institute of Agricultural and Food Market Services)
- Two-year programmes of activities, divided into project sheets (i.e., fields of activity)
 - Monitoring & Evaluation
 - ACA & Natura 2000
 - Organic farming
 - Forestry
 - Statistics, analyses and support to RD programming
 - Social farming
 - AKIS & knowledge transfer
 - Broadband observatory
 - ...
 - Local development



L.E.A.D.E.R. Network

- improve Leader's governance and implementation
- strengthen the introduction of innovation in local development policies and processes
- promote the dissemination of information about Leader

Since 2021, a specific WP on "Support for the promotion of smart villages in rural areas"



SMART VILLAGES IN ITALY BEFORE THE CAP STRATEGIC PLAN



Community regeneration projects – Leader specific intervention in Tuscany

- Born to counter the effects of COVID-19 emergency on rural areas
- Expanded in public-private participatory planning actions at local level to support the development of ecosystem services, circular economy initiatives and the enhancement of common goods (7 intervention themes)
- The LAG proposes a first phase of activation and listening to the territory
- The local community submits a project idea
- The LAG guides the partnership in drafting and implementing the actual project

NATIONAL RURAL NETWORK / CAP NETWORK SUPPORT FOR SMART VILLAGES

Starting in 2021, the Italian National Rural Network (NRN) launched several activities to support the Smart Village approach and facilitate the implementation of Smart Village strategies within the CAP Strategic Plan

Contributing to draft the CAP SP intervention "SRG07 – Cooperation for local, rural development and Smart Villages" under Art. 77 of Reg. (EU) 2021/2115

Meetings with regional MAs to discuss the introduction of support for Smart Village Strategies in the CAP SP, according to the indications of FU's *Tools*.

Cooperation 23-27, local development and Smart Villages: guide to read the PAC SP Intervention and draft Regional Programming Complements

SMART VILLAGES IN THE ITALIAN CAP STRATEGIC PLAN 2023-2027

4 cooperation areas:

- local food systems, supply chains and markets
- social and economic inclusion
- environmental sustainability
- rural tourism



Smart Village intervention will be implemented by 10 Italian regions

• Approx. 64,5 M euros




Regional MAs could adapt or limit cooperation themes/areas, eligible costs, beneficiaries, selection criteria, etc.




Smart Villages will be supported also through LEADER

•LAGs can provide for SV intervention in their LDSs, financing local partnerships, OR be themselves partners (even lead partner) of Smart Village strategies financed at regional level



Not only Smart Village strategies

The intervention also support other forms of cooperation (former sub-measures 16.4, 16.5, 16.9)





47 LAGs (out of 98) implementing SRG07 Approx. 37 M euros

Not all LDSs are yet fully available, so budget (and content) not definitive!









SMART RURAL HUB

In early 2022, LEADER Network launched <u>Smart Rural Hub</u>, a **capacity building initiative**, in collaboration with <u>Forum LEADER</u> (an Italian association of LAGs for exchange of experiences and debate on local development related topics), to:

- encourage a common vision about Smart Villages
- prepare the ground to start implementing SV strategies in the coming years
- increase the expertise of LAGs and other local actors on this topic



• 1 kick off webinar

- 4 thematic workshops (cooperation areas)
- 1 webinar on innovative financing solutions & partnership forms
- 1 meeting to present the methodological guide on SV, with discussion of central themes such as governance, communication, digital technologies, sectoral skills

FORUM LEADER "YOUTH"

Plans for the near future

Further discussion and in-depth analysis on the implementation of Smart Villages as a tool for territorial planning

Make clear, within the SRG07 procedures, the functioning of the implementation system, the indicators and the results to be achieved

In the implementation phase, encourage territorial approaches to integrate the various local development policies



Continue and strengthen "Smart Rural Hub"

- Providing training to actors (LAGs, municipalities, local parterships)
- Providing tools for integrated planning (context indicators, maps, information on local digital infrastructures, etc.)
- Organizing focuses on specific topics
- Driving local actors in adapting and repeating innovative solutions already developed (completed or in the process of being completed) by another local actor, on a key theme of the SRG07 intervention



Develop a methodological guide and an accompanying action for the writing of tenders that consider both the key elements required by the Smart Village approach and innovative forms of partner selection



Carry on capacity building actions for local partnerships willing to respond to SRG07 calls at regional level (not LAGs calls)



Plan study visits to Smart Village experiences that have already started



Create a database on the implementation of the SRG07 intervention, both at regional and LAG level
