

Coordination with other Funds: CSF and PC

Europe 2020 strategy

Common Strategic Framework (CSF)

 covering the EAFRD, ERDF, ESF, Cohesion Fund and EMFF, and reflecting EU2020 through common thematic objectives to be addressed by key actions for each of the funds

Partnership Contract

- national document outlining the intended use of the funds in the pursuit of EU2020 objectives

Rural development policy: EAFRD

Other CSF funds (ERDF, ESF, CF, EMFF)

Innovation, Environment and Climate Change as cross-cutting objectives

Priorities

Fostering knowledge transfer and Innovation in agriculture, forestry and rural areas

Enhancing competitiveness of all types of agriculture and farm viability Promoting food chain organisation and risk management in agriculture Restoring, preserving and enhancing ecosystems dependent on agriculture and forestry Promoting resource



EU 2020 Headline Targets

1. Employment

• 75% of the 20-64 year-olds to be employed

2. R&D / innovation

 3% of the EU's GDP (public and private combined) to be invested in R&D/innovation

3. Climate change / Energy

- greenhouse gas emissions 20% (or even 30%, if the conditions are right) lower than 1990
- 20% of energy from renewables
- 20% increase in energy efficiency

4. Education

- reducing school drop-out rates below 10%
- at least 40% of 30-34-yearolds completing third level education

5. Poverty / social exclusion

 at least 20 million fewer people in or at risk of poverty and social exclusion

Partnership Agreement – main elements

- 1. Preparation of the PA by the MS and involvement of partners
- 2. Arrangements to ensure alignment with Europe 2020
- 3. Arrangements to ensure effective implementation
- 4. Description of the integrated approach to territorial development



Programming RD Main novelties for 2014 – 2020

- Improving clarity of policy framework
 - Focus areas for each priority
 - Six Union Priorities for Rural Development
 - Three cross-cutting objectives
- Strengthening result-orientation of programmes
 - Ex-ante target setting (simplified common indicators)
 - Reporting on targets
 - Ex-ante conditionalities
 - Performance Framework
- Increasing flexibility in the use of measure
 - Each measure can serve more than one priority/focus area



Programming RD (2) Main novelties for 2014

- Coherent framework for the EU funds
 - Common mechanisms CSF
 - Strengthening coherence of funds
- Harmonisation of rules
 - Common model for CLLD
 - Common eligible rules
 - Simplified cost approaches
- Fostering research and innovation
 - Better linking research with practice

EIP on Agricultural Productivity and Sustainability

Aimed at promoting resource efficiency, building bridges between research and practice and generally encouraging innovation

Acts through operational groups responsible for innovative projects and is supported by a network

 Operational groups: bringing together farmers, researchers, advisors, businesses and other actors concerned by innovation in the agricultural sector

The EAFRD contributes through:

- Support for the EIP operational groups and the EIP Network
- Other rural development measures, e.g. Co-operation, Investment in physical assets, Business development, Knowledge transfer and Farm Advisory Services

Following endorsement by Council and European Parliament, establishment of Steering Board during first trimester of 2012

EIP Network to be set-up in the second half of 2012



Fund contribution and financial engineering

General: Single co-financing rate across measures up to:

- 85% in less developed regions, outermost regions and smaller Aegean islands
- 50% in other regions

Minimum 25% of the EAFRD envelope to be allocated to climate change mitigation and adaptation and land management measures

Agri-environment-climate payment, organic farming, LFAs

Minimum of 5 % of EAFRD envelope to be spent on Leader

Higher co-financing rate – up to 80% for:

- Knowledge transfer and information actions
- Setting up of producer groups
- Co-operation
- Leader
- Business start-up aid for young farmers

Up to 100% EAFRD co-financing for innovative operations financed with capped funds from direct payments (1^{st pillar})

Easier and clearer framework for the use of the financial instruments:

- Financial instruments at EU level, directly or indirectly managed by the Commission
- Financial instruments at national, regional or trans-national level, managed by the MS

Monitoring/Evaluation/Networking

CMEF for the Monitoring and evaluation

- List of common indicators, based on the current situation and financial execution, Outputs, result and impact of the Program
- Monitoring
 - Annual progress reports and progress report on the implementation of the Partnership Contract
- Evaluation
 - Ex-ante; Evaluation plan for the Program period; Ex-post

Networking

- European network for rural development
- European evaluation network for rural development
- FIP Network



Programming in a nutshell

Broad continuity in approach and principles:

1. General SWOT of the programme area:

- Competitiveness of the agri-food sector
- Environment and climate
- Socio-economic situation of rural areas

2. Detailed needs assessment

By priority and focus area

3. Strategic response:

- Choice of relevant priorities/focus areas,
- Target setting
- Planning of measures, outputs, financial resources



The work ahead: how to progress from now?

- Preparation of PC: coordination and consistency with other policies - active role!
- Analysis of needs and challenges of programming areas
- Setting priorities / focus areas
- Reflection on relevant measures to serve the priorities/focus areas selected
- ... building on lessons learnt in current and previous programming periods



Conclusions

- Better preparation: enhanced coordination at all levels (Union, national, regional, local)
- Increased focus on partnership: broad involvement of stakeholders
- Increased focus on innovation
- Effective targeting: focus on simplification for beneficiaries and reduction of error rate!
- Iterative process for finalising programmes
