
•APR 2007: main focus on evaluation system in the national/regional context

•APR 2008+: main focus on evaluation activities undertaken (incl. capacity building and methodological work), data collection, and difficulties encountered



I. The Ongoing Evaluation Sections in APRs - overview

 1. Overall the sections on ongoing evaluation in the APRS for 2008 vary in their degree of completeness & coverage of indicative topics



1. The Ongoing Evaluation Sections in APRs - overview



Use crossreferences if information is provided in previous

reports or sections.

Pay particular attention to the coverage of the topics 'evaluation activities', 'networking activities' and 'difficulties encountered'.

Recommendations for the MS:

- ✓ Use the evaluation section of the APR as a tool to demonstrate progress in ongoing evaluation.
- ✓ Describe in sufficient detail all (!) 5 topics indicated in Guidance Note B of the CMEF Handbook.



2. The system established to ensure ongoing evaluation

- MAs describe establishment of evaluation systems
 - Late approval of many RDPs
 - 80% of APRs still cover description of evaluation system
- Ongoing admin. preparations for tendering evaluation
 - 55 APRs mention selection procedure for external evaluators
 - Different outsourcing models for evaluation
- Steering Groups are becoming operational
 - 36 SGs mentioned in 2008 (14 in 2007)
 - Activities: input for ToRs; selection of evaluator etc.

2. The system established to ensure ongoing evaluation



Who does what, how and when?

Recommendations for the MS:

- ✓ Report comprehensively on evaluation system and evaluation plan
- ✓ Describe administrative arrangements taken for hiring (MTE) evaluators
- ✓ Provide information on coordination between evaluation stakeholders

ToR preparation, type of tender, start and closure dates, activities outsourced, information on contracted companies...

Interaction mechanisms with evaluators, Steering Groups...



3. Ongoing evaluation activities

- Increased coverage of ongoing evaluation activities
 - 50% of APRs report on the review of result/impact indicators
 - 30% mention the review of intervention logic
 - 20% describe actions to review evaluation questions
- Progress in developing evaluation methodologies
 - 38 APRs mention work on evaluation methodologies and tools
- Some lessons from ex-post & ex-ante are followed up
- Thematic studies are increasingly used (21 APRs)





3. Ongoing evaluation activities

Recommendations for the MS:

- ✓ Report on evaluation activities in relation to your evaluation plan
- ✓ Give an overview on preparatory activities for the MTE
- ✓ Outline specific evaluation methodologies and studies
- ✓ Refer to follow-up activities on lessons from ex post 2000-06 and ex-ante

E.g. reviews of intervention logic, result and impact indicators, and evaluation questions.

Specify themes or outcomes of outsourced studies, surveys, case studies etc.



4. Systems for data collection and management

- Data collection attracts major attention of APRs
- Different organisational models for data systems
- Main data gaps relate to indicators for environmental measures, GVA-related and non-agricultural activities
- Processing of unharmonized data as challenge
- Activities to improve data quality & overcome gaps





Recommendations for the MS

- ✓ Present systems for data collection in detail and describe responsibilities.
- ✓ Report on main data sources & types.
- ✓ Provide overview on data gaps and activities to overcome data gaps.
- ✓ Describe arrangements taken to provide evaluators with necessary data.

E.g. include a diagram or description of the architecture of the system for data management; information flows etc.







- **Networking activities are gradually increasing**
 - e.g. focus groups organized by Evaluation Helpdesk; Helpdesk missions and visits to MS
 - few APRs (17) report on evaluation-related workshops at national or international level
 - few networking activities are reported for MS with regional programmes and in New Member States
- Capacity building is slowly taking up but remains modest





Recommendations for the MS:

- ✓ Provide overview on participation in relevant networking activities.
- ✓ Describe the details of purpose, outcome and follow-up of networking events, workshops and seminars.
- ✓ State references on further documentation of networking events.
- ✓ Highlight capacity building actions.

...at local, regional, national and EU level

Who are the initiators, the participants? What are the lessons learned etc.

e.g. publications, internet-links, etc.



6. Difficulties encountered and need for additional work

- More difficulties encountered, but also more practical in nature, e.g.
 - related to IT systems
 - challenges in dealing with simultaneous evaluation tasks, (e.g. ex-post evaluation 2000-2006 and the preparation of MTE 2010)
 - related to practical application of the overall CMEF
 - related to fulfilling the requirements of the monitoring tables

6. Difficulties encountered and need for additional work



Recommendations for the MS

- ✓ Describe most relevant difficulties experienced in fulfilling ongoing evaluation activities.
- ✓ Report on planned and realized solutions for overcoming these difficulties.
- ✓ Differentiate between difficulties to be resolved at programme, Member State or EU level.

Give references to previous chapters where problems are reported.

Describe the solutions adopted, the involved actors, the lessons learnt.

	 Major progress towards the preparation of mid-term and ex-post evaluation (i.e. where do you stand?)
2. The system established for ensuring ongoing evaluation	Evaluation system and evaluation plan: Who does what, how and when?
	 Administrative arrangements for selecting evaluators (ongoing, MTE, ex post) e.g. preparation of ToR, type of tender, start and closure dates, activities outsourced, information on contracted companies etc.
	 Coordination with evaluation stakeholders i.e. interaction with evaluators, Steering Groups etc.
3. The evaluation activities undertaken (ongoing and finished)	✓ Evaluation activities in relation to evaluation plan
	 Preparatory activities for the main evaluation events (MTE, ex post) e.g. reviews of intervention logic, result and impact indicators, and evaluation questions
	✓ Information on the follow-up of previous evaluations, if relevant
	✓ Outline of specific evaluation methodologies developed
	✓ Themes, outcomes and use of commissioned studies
4. Data collection	 Approaches and systems for data collection and management (information flows)
	✓ Main data sources and types used (incl. data providers)
	 Overview on main data gaps and activities to overcome such gaps (indication on data quality)
	✓ Arrangements taken to provide evaluators with data
5. Networking activities of the people involved in evaluation	 Participation in relevant networking activities at programme, national and EU level (e.g. interaction with evaluation stakeholders, with national evaluation network, with Evaluation Expert Network, with research community etc.)
	 Purpose, outcome and follow-up of networking events, workshops and seminars (e.g. the initiators, the participants, the lessons learned etc.)
	 References to further documentation of these networking events (e.g. links to websites and publications)
	 Capacity building actions in the field of evaluation, e.g. trainings, seminars etc.
6. Difficulties encountered and need for additional work	 Difficulties experienced in carrying out ongoing evaluation activities (use cross-references where problems are reported in other sections of the APR, distinguish at which level they have to be resolved)
	 Planned and realized solutions for overcoming difficulties (solutions adopted, involved actors, lessons learnt)
