Most elements proposed by the Council in its general approach were endorsed by co-legislators.

Very few indicators were added.

Nothing is agreed until everything is agreed



1. Main changes related to Result Indicators

- R.12, R.13, R.14: proposal of the Council was to merge the 3 indicators while keeping the breakdown (i.e. R.12 Mitigation and adaptation) → co-legislators agreed to maintain the split as in the COMM original proposal:
 - R.12 Adaptation to climate change;
 - R.13 Reducing emissions in the livestock sector;
 - R.14 Carbon storage in soils and biomass
- R.16 Enhance energy efficiency: deleted



1. Main changes related to Result Indicators

- R.17 Afforested land: a breakdown was added
 - Afforestation
 - Agroforestry
 - Restoration
- **R.18** Improving and protecting soils: the **label** was expanded, but no change in content ("[...] to improve the soil quality and biota (such as reduce tillage, soil cover with crops, crop rotation included with leguminous crops)")
- R.21 Sustainable nutrient management: kept in Annex I



1. Main changes related to Result Indicators

- R.23 Environment/climate related investments: **split into 3 RI** as proposed by the Council:
 - R.16a Investments related to climate
 - R.23 Investments related to natural resources
 - R.27a Investments related to biodiversity
- **R.25** Supporting sustainable forest management: **merged** with R.26 Supporting sustainable forest management as proposed by the Council
- **R.29a** Preserving beehives: added (largely supported by MS in the last GREX and proposed by the EP)
- R.39 Organic farming: added (proposed by both co-legislators)



2. Main changes related to Output Indicators

Most of the Council proposals were retained:

- Split of output indicators by type of intervention (e.g. one output by direct payment), but no split of O.8 (risk management) and O.12 (Natura + WFD)
- Possibility to use other units than operations for investments and cooperation
- Changes implied by the simplification of the performance clearance of sectoral interventions managed via operational programmes (updated 0.33 (operational programmes), new 0.34a (wine sector), deleted 0.34 (promotion activities))



2. Main changes related to Output Indicators

- **Deleted**: O.7 (beneficiaries for support YF), O.30 (non-farmers trained), O.32 (ha to conditionality)
- Added: O.18a (on farm non-productive investments), O.29a (plans, studies and awareness actions)
- The below indicators are kept in Annex I
 - O.2 (advice action for innovation), O.3 (CAP support beneficiaries), O.31 (ha under environmental practices)
- Changes to Annex I related to modifications of interventions:
 - Added: O.22a (new farmers receiving installation grants (other than young farmers under O.22))
 - On hold: when discussions on the definition of interventions are still on-going (e.g. units for AECMC)

3. Main changes related to C/I Indicators

- No substantial change with regards to Impact Indicators (only minor editing to the labels)
- Exceptions:
 - I.19 Enhanceding biodiversity protection: Percentage of species and habitats of Community interest related to agriculture with stable or increasing trends, with a breakdown of the percentage for wild pollinators species¹

¹ The analysis will be complemented with the EU-wide pollinator monitoring scheme once available.

• **I.20a Increased agro-biodiversity in farming system crop diversity** (indicator on crop diversification, which corresponds to R.11 in the current CMEF: Crop diversity).
