Monitoring and evaluation framework



- Role of common and programme-specific evaluation questions and indicators in evaluation:
 - Demonstration of contribution of policy
 - □ Focus and support the evaluation
- **Triangular consistency**: objectives, questions and indicators
- How to design programme-specific evaluation questions:
 - □ The level of the objective in the hierarchy;
 - □ The formulation of the objective;
 - □ The means to achieve the objective;
 - □ The means to answer the evaluation question.
- How to develop programme-specific indicators using judgement criteria

Examples of programme-specific result indicators

Evaluation design, methods European Evaluation Network and data

- The evaluation design should allow assessing NRN achievements, results and impacts attributable to the NRN activities (is counterfactual analysis suitable for NRN assessment?).
- Using a **mix** of quantitative and qualitative methods
- Links between indicators, methods and data

Examples of methods in the Toolbox

Key points to address in evaluation



- □ Clarify the **purpose** of NRN
- Define NRN objectives
- Construct the NRN intervention logic to address specific needs
- Design NRN monitoring and evaluation framework linked to intervention logic
- Decide and design the self-assessment and link it to M&E
- Identify methods and data collection techniques
- □ Assess results, impacts and achievements of NRN

Common output indicators fiches

Common NRN objectives, groups of actions and indicators, and links between them

Suggested methods for the assessment of NRNs

Practice in evaluation of NRN (IT, ES, FI)

Examples of topics to be included in the questionnaire for NRN assessment

Main comments on NRN guidelines

- Clarify the non-binding nature of the suggested result indicators and judgement criteria
- Enhance the consistency on some of the terms used throughout the guidelines
- Increase cross references to the different parts of the guidelines and to legal acts
- Update some of the **bibliography** and references provided

Main comments on NRN guidelines





Content related comments:

- Link operational objectives to the common and network-specific groups of activities
- Clarify the counterfactual situation in case of NRNs
- Describe the difference between NRN added value and indirect effects
- Provide more detailed information about the social network analysis
- Provide an assessment of the examples of NRN / NRNP evaluation described in the Toolbox
